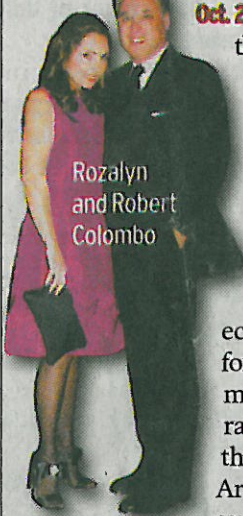

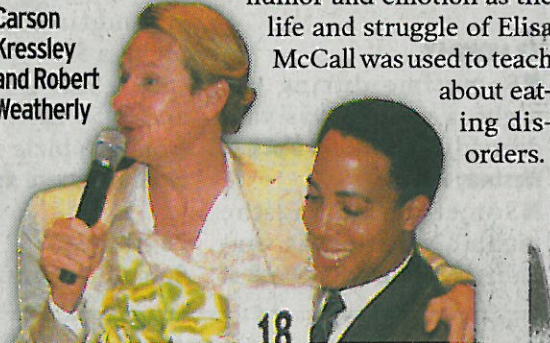
## Life Lessons Luncheon
